Registration for the IX PanAm Aquatics Masters Championships 2024 will be completed via the designated link on the official event website. All registration fees are to be processed through secure online payment methods. Online registration will open on January 19, 2024, with the deadline for accepting registrations being May 15, 2024.









ELIGIBILITY

All Masters Swimmers affiliated with their respective Federations can participate in the PanAm Aquatics Masters Championships 2024. Swimmers from continents other than the Americas can participate as guest athletes.

Duplicate awards will be presented to guest athletes from other continents, ensuring that the awards for athletes from the Americas remain unaffected.

All participants must represent a club, association, or fitness academy of a World Aquatics Member Federation. Athletes representing national teams will not be eligible for registration.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Please refer to the Trinidad and Tobago Ministry of Foreign and CARICOM Affairs website for specific visa and passport requirements. Visas information: foreign/services/visas

AIRLINES

The primary international gateway is Piarco International Airport (POS) in Trinidad. It serves as the main point of entry for international attendees.

HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

CUSTOMS DECLARATION

Upon arrival in Trinidad and Tobago, you must complete a Customs and Immigration Declaration form. The airline will distribute forms upon arrival in Trinidad and Tobago.

The official currency of Trinidad and Tobago is the Trinidad and Tobago Dollar (TTD). The conversion rate is subject to market fluctuations; however, as of the time of this publication, the approximate exchange rate is 1 US Dollar (USD) = 6.8 TTD.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

Various modes of local transportation are at your disposal in Trinidad and Tobago, ensuring ease of movement throughout your stay.

BANKING

Banks are generally open from Monday to Friday, with currency exchange services available at major banks and airports.

CREDIT CARDS

Most establishments accept major credit cards such as VISA, MasterCard, and American Express.

SHOPPING

Shopping centres and stores generally operate from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm. Some convenience stores and gas stations are open 24/7.

ATTIRE

Trinidad and Tobago has a tropical climate, and casual wear is generally acceptable, even in most dining and entertainment venues.

MEDICAL AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Medical facilities are available both publicly and privately. It is highly recommended that visitors secure international health insurance. Emergency medical personnel and services will be available at all competition venues.

MEDIA

Trinidad and Tobago has a range of newspapers and television channels available in most accommodation options.

ELECTRICITY

In Trinidad and Tobago, electricity is supplied at two different voltages: 110 volts and 220 volts, both at a frequency of 60 Hz. The country primarily uses Type A and Type B electrical outlets.

Type A: This is a two-pin plug with flat parallel pins.

Type B is a three-pin plug with flat parallel pins and a grounding pin. <u>Sample of power-plugs-sockets</u> used in TTO











For International Visitors: If your devices use different plug types or are not compatible with the 115V/220V, 60 Hz electrical system, it is highly recommended that you travel with appropriate plug adapters and voltage converters to ensure the usability of your electronic devices during your stay.

WATER

The water supply in Trinidad and Tobago is generally safe to drink.

ENTRY PROCEDURES FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS

Participants must present and submit the following documentation during registration: proof of age and a copy of their Federation ID/letter issued by their respective National Swimming Federation.

ENTRY DEADLINE

The final deadline for all entries to be received by the Organizing Committee is Thursday, May 15, 2024. Please note that some events may close their entries earlier to comply with the mandated 10-hour competition rule.

AQUA AFFILIATION

All Masters Competitors must be affiliated with a World Aquatics Member Federation and provide evidence of this affiliation through a Master's licence, Club Registration Card, or Federation membership card/letter.

ONLINE REGISTRATION

Registration can only be completed online through Deporte Virtual. For more details, please visit our official website https://paqmasters.panamaquaticsevents.com/. All required documentation, as outlined in "Entry Procedures," must be submitted on or before May 15, 2024. The Organizing Committee will acknowledge all received entries through an automatic message

Key Entry Form Documents:

By completing your online registration, each applicant agrees to the terms and conditions outlined in the application form, including any waivers or disclaimers from the Organizing Committee.

The designated team representative must complete the appropriate entry form for teams participating in water polo, swimming relays, artistic swimming, and synchronized diving.

Proof of age must be submitted in PDF format. Acceptable documents include a national identity card, passport, driver's license, birth certificate, and photo ID.

Proof of Federation affiliation or permission must be presented during registration.

A completed and signed disclaimer form must also be attached to exempt the Organizing Committee from specific responsibilities.

All payments, including individual registration fees and team-specific fees, must be made online using a credit or debit card.











Fax submissions will not be accepted. All entries must be made online.

Fees paid at the time of registration are non-refundable and non-transferable. By registering, the Athlete agrees to these terms. The Organizing Committee will review these terms if a postponement or cancellation occurs.

LETTER OF INVITATION

Participants from countries facing visa challenges should request an invitation letter by completing the google form attached to this link <u>Invitation letter request</u> with your details. The Organising Committee will use this information to generate and send you a personalized invitation letter.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This manual provides most of the information athletes will need for their application. For further inquiries, please contact the Organizing Committee at the email address.

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

All athletes must be fully aware of the information provided in this manual to participate in the IX PANAM AQUATICS MASTERS CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024.

SWIMMING

To adhere to the PanAm Aquatics Masters Technical Committee's mandate of not exceeding 10 hours of competition per day, we may limit the number of athletes allowed to register for specific swimming events. Consequently, some events may close their entries before the overall entry deadline. We aim to offer athletes and their families ample time to explore all that Trinidad and Tobago has to offer.

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT: 18 years

The competitor's age will be considered as of December 31, 2024.

AGE GROUPS

Individual events will have the following age groups: 18-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65¬69,70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94, and so on in five-year increments.

Relay events will be based on the total age of team members as of December 31, 2024. 80-99, 100-119, 120-159, 160-199, 200-239, 240-279, 280-319, 320-359, and 40-year increments as high as necessary.











TECHNICAL MEETING

The swimming technical meeting will be held on July 17, 2024, at 16:00 hours. The location will be announced on the official website.

LOCATION

The events will take place at a National Aquatic Centre in Trinidad and Tobago.

POOL RECOGNITION

The pool will be open for recognition and warm-up from July 18, 2024, from 08:00 to 18:00. During competition days, pools will be available from 06:30 to 08:00.

POOL CHARACTERISTICS

The competition pool will be 50m long, with ten lanes and a depth of 2.45m. A secondary pool with similar dimensions and a depth of 3m will also be available.

WARM-UP/WARM-DOWN POOLS

A 25m long pool with 20 lanes and a depth of 1.40m will be available for warm-up and warm-down.

TRAINING PROVISION

The championship pool will be open for training from 06:30 am to 08:00 am

WARM-UP PROCEDURES

Swimmers must adhere to specific warm-up procedures, including entering the pool feet-first and following designated sprint lanes.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS

A swimmer may enter a maximum of five events but no more than two events per day and up to four relays.

COMPETITION NOTES:

All starts will be conducted in accordance with AQUA Masters swimming rules. Swimmers who complete their races must remain in the water until the next race begins or follow the referee's signals. The one-start rule will be in effect for all swimming events.

SEEDING:

Events will be pre-seeded based on the times submitted during registration. The oldest age groups will be seeded first, and within each age group, the slowest heats will be swum first.











Note: The 400m and 800m freestyle and the 400m individual medley will be seeded by time, not by age group, with slower times swimming in the initial heats.

RELAY EVENTS:

All relay team members must be affiliated with the same swimming club. Swimmers may not represent more than one team per relay event. The relay team registration forms, indicating the pre-registered athletes, must be submitted to the Organizing Committee's secretary during the Technical Meeting.

Substitutions within teams that alter the team's age group are allowed until 10:00 am on 17/07/2024 and will not be accepted afterwards.

DEADLINE:

The final date for all entries is May 15, 2024.

MIXED RELAYS:

"Mixed" refers to teams comprising both sexes, i.e., two females and two males.

REPORTING:

Swimmers are responsible for reporting to the clerk of the course (call room) at least 15 minutes before their scheduled races.

MEDALS:

Medals for individual events will be awarded from 1st to 10th place in each age group. For relay events, medals will be awarded from 1st to 3rd place in each age group, with each team member receiving a medal.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

Swimmers in the 18-24 age group are not permitted to participate in certain relay age groups, as specified.











OPEN WATER

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT:

Participants must be 18 years old.

AGE DETERMINING DATE:

The competitor's age will be considered as of December 31, 2024.

AGE GROUPS:

The age groups are 18-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90-94, and additional five-year increments as necessary.

Note: The 2024 Championship will adhere to AQUA regulations, although PANAM Aquatics may make exceptions regarding age groups.

SEEDING:

Swimmers will be seeded based on their 1500 LC meter times, starting with the fastest series. The race organizers will determine cut-off times for each age group in consultation with the referee and the PANAM Aquatics Masters Technical Committee.

SWIM CAPS:

All swimmers must wear highly visible, numbered swim caps provided by the organizers.

USE OF SWIMSUITS:

Only AQUA-approved swimsuits will be permitted. No wetsuits will be allowed (per rule water temperature has to be under 18 ° C.) https://approved.swimwear.fina.org/

TRAINING PROVISION:

Training opportunities will be available at the Aquatic Centre during the week of the competition and at other designated locations in Trinidad and Tobago. Specific details will be announced closer to the event.

TECHNICAL MEETING:

The Open Water technical meeting is scheduled for Thursday, July 25, 2024. The location will be announced on the official host website.

COMPETITION DATE:

The Open Water event will take place on Friday, July 26, 2024, with a tentative start time of 9:30 am.













LENGTH OF COURSE:

The course will be 3 kilometres long. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify the course length based on medical advice and weather conditions.

COMPETITION VENUE:

The competition venue for the event is set to be the picturesque Maracas Bay.

WATER TEMPERATURE: 25 to 28 °C

TRANSPORT:

The official host website will provide Transportation details and schedules. (Competition website)

TIME LIMITS:

Swimmers unable to complete the 3 km distance within 90 minutes are advised not to enter.

MARSHALLING AREA:

Athletes must report to the marshalling area 30 minutes before their wave starts. A course map will be displayed.

SAFETY:

Safety boats will accompany athletes throughout the course.

CHANGING AREA:

A designated area for equipment and changing will be provided, along with numbered caps for each swimmer.

SUPPORT FACILITIES:

Shower and changing facilities, as well as a catering tent for athlete recovery, will be available.

MEDALS:

Medals will be awarded from 1st to 10th place in each age group.











DIVING

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT:

The minimum age for participation is 25 years.

AGE DETERMINING DATE:

As of December 31, 2024, the competitor's age will be considered for age group categorization.

AGE GROUPS:

For Springboard and Platform events, the age groups are as follows: 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, and 80+. Additional five-year increments will be added as necessary.

For Synchronized Diving, age groups are determined by adding the ages of the two divers.

Note: The 2024 Championship will adhere to World Aquatics regulations, although PANAM Aquatics may make exceptions regarding age groups.

PRACTICE PROVISION:

Practice sessions will be available from July 20 and July 21, 2024, between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm at the designated Aquatic Complex in Trinidad and Tobago. Additional practice opportunities will be available on competition days, and details will be provided upon accreditation.

TECHNICAL MEETING:

A Technical Meeting for athletes, coaches, and managers will be held on Sunday, July 21, 2024, at 10:00 am. The location will be announced on the official host website.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS:

Divers may participate in a maximum of five events, including 1-m springboard, 3-m springboard, platform, synchronized 3-m springboard, and synchronized platform events. Divers can only represent one Federation in each synchronized event.

WARM-UP PROVISION:

Warm-up time will be allocated before each competition session.

COMPETITION VENUE:

The venue will be the National Aquatic Centre in Trinidad and Tobago.

POOL CHARACTERISTICS:

The pool measures $25 \text{ m} \times 20 \text{ m}$ with a depth of 5 m. It is equipped with two 1-m springboards, three 3-m springboards, and platforms at heights of 5 m and 10 m. There is no 7.5m platform.

COMPETITION FORMAT:

Divers may select their dives from the AQUA. Handbook's dive table.

TECHNICAL DIVING RULES:

The competition will adhere to AQUA Technical Rules Competition Regulations Part V and Part VIII.5

DIVE SHEETS:

Official diving forms must be submitted 24 hours before the event starts and will be available at the accreditation point.

CORRECTIONS:

Changes to dive sheets will incur a **USD 10** penalty and must be made between 24 and 3 hours before the event.

REPORTING:

Divers are responsible for being present at the start of their designated events.

MEDALS:

Medals will be awarded from 1st to 6th place in each age group. Only the first three medals will be awarded if fewer than six divers are in an age group.











ARTISTIC SWIMMING

MINIMUM AGE LIMIT:

The minimum age for participation is 20 years.

AGE-DETERMINING DATE:

As of December 31, 2024, the competitor's age will be considered for age group categorization.

COMPETITION DATES:

Technical Routines (Solo Female and Solo Male, Duet, Mixed Duet and Team): July 17, 2024 Free Routines (Duet, Mixed duet, and Combinations): July 18, 2024 Free Routines (Solo Female and Solo Male and Teams): July 19, 2024

COMPETITION VENUE:

The event will be held at the National Aquatic Centre Balmain Couva, Trinidad and Tobago.

POOL CHARACTERISTICS:

Length: 30 meters Width: 25 meters Depth: 3 meters

Grandstand: Seating for 200 spectators

AGE GROUPS:

Solo and Duet Events: 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70-79, 80+

Teams: 20-34, 35-49, 50-64, 65+ Free Combination: 20-39, 40-64, 65+

For Duet, Free Combination, and Team events, the category is determined by the average age of the competitors.

Note: The 2024 Championship will adhere to AQUA regulations, although exceptions regarding age groups may be made. Free and technical events will be combined.

TECHNICAL MEETING:

A Technical Meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 16, 2024, at 10:00 am. The location will be the National Aquatic Centre Balmain Couva. The meeting will cover various procedural aspects, including:

PRACTICE PROVISION:

Practice opportunities with music will be available at the National Aquatic Centre. Additional practice slots will be allocated based on the number of entries. Details will be provided upon arrival.

SOUND EQUIPMENT:

Competitors are responsible for providing their music, which must be uploaded to the competition platform. A link for uploading will be sent one month before the competition.

ENTRY RESTRICTIONS:

Athletes may enter a maximum of three routine events and one free Combination. All competitors in duets, teams, and free combinations must represent the same club.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE:

Teams: Minimum of 4 and a maximum of 8 members.

There is no penalty for less than 8 members.

Free Routine Combination: Minimum of 4 and a maximum of 10 members.

TIME LIMITS:

As per World Aquatics Competition Regulations VIII.7.4.1, each type of routine has specific time limits.

No minimum time limit. Time limits, including the ten (10) seconds for the deck movement.

Technical Routines - Solo: 2 minutes **Free Routine - Solo:** 2 minutes 15 seconds

Technical Routines- Duet: 2 minutes 20 seconds

Free Routine- Duet: 2 minutes 45 seconds

Technical Routine Team: 2 minutes 50 seconds **Free Routine Team:** 3 Minutes 30 seconds

Free Combination: 4 minutes

There shall be an allowance of (5) seconds less or plus the allotted time for all routines.











SCORING:

Scoring will be conducted in accordance with World Aquatics Competition Manual VIII.8.1.5.5.2.

FINAL RESULTS:

Final results will be determined as per AQUA AS Rule 20. The first five required elements will have a degree of difficulty of 1.0 as part of the scoring calculations.

REPORTING:

All competitors, including members of duets and teams, must report to the designated area at least 30 minutes before the commencement of their respective events.

MEDALS:

Medals will be awarded for 1st to 3rd place in each age group. Each member, including alternates, will receive a medal.

Event Categories

AQUA Comp Reg VIII.7.2: The Masters Artistic Swimming competition encompasses Solo, Duet, Team, and Free Combination events. A Technical Solo and a Free Solo are collectively considered a single event. Likewise, Technical and Free Duets form one event, as do Technical and Free Teams. Free Combination stands as an individual event.

Requirements for a Free Combination Routine, see Appendix V

Technical Routine Requirements

General Guidelines: Additional elements may be incorporated into routines. All figures and their components must align with the specifications outlined in Appendix II. Each element should be executed with precision, control, and uniformity.

While the choice of music is at the discretion of the participants, it is permissible to use the same musical selection for both the Technical and Free Routines.

Additionally, competitors have the option to wear goggles during their performances.

Solo Routine Elements

Elements 1 to 5 must be performed in the order listed on the "Elements Card". Element 6 may be executed anytime during the routine.

Fishtail: Starting from a Front Layout Position, transition into a Front Pike Position. Lift one leg to a Fishtail Position and the other to a Vertical Position. The ending is optional.

Split Position: This is followed by either a front or back walkout.

Spinning 180°: Initiate from a back layout and perform a tuck somersault. From a bent-knee position, execute a 108° spin as the legs join into a vertical position at the ankles, followed by submergence.











Travelling Ballet Leg Combination: Commence in a Back Layout Position and include any two of the following positions: Right or Left Bent Knee Back Layout, Right or Left Ballet Leg, Right or Left Flamingo, or Double Ballet Leg.

Barracuda Bent Knee: From a Back Pike Position with legs perpendicular and toes just below the surface, execute a Thrust. One leg is drawn along the inside of the other extended leg to assume a Bent Knee Vertical Position. A vertical descent is executed at the same tempo as the Thrust.

Two Forms of Propulsion: Must include Egg Beater travelling sideways and/or forward. Arm movements are optional.

Duet Routine Elements

Elements 1 to 5 must be performed in the order listed on the "Element Card". Elements 6 & 7 may be executed anytime during the routine.

Elements 1 to 6 are the same as the Solo routine.

Joined Action: The swimmers must be physically connected to perform a connected figure, float, or stroke. The action must be performed simultaneously. Minor actions are permitted, but stacks, lifts, platforms, and throws are prohibited.

Team Routine Elements

Elements 1 to 5 must be performed in the order listed on the "Elements Card". Elements 6 - 9 may be executed anytime during the routine.

1 to 7 are the same as for the Duet routine.

Cadence Action: Identical movements performed sequentially by all team members. If more than one cadence action is performed, they must be consecutive.

Patterns: Must include a circle and a straight line. Elements can be performed in either pattern.

Except for the initial Deck Work and Entry and any Joined Actions, all swimmers must execute both mandatory and additional elements in unison, facing the same direction. However, variations in the manner of propulsion and the direction faced are allowable during transitions between patterns.











WATER POLO

Age Requirements and Classification **Minimum Age Limit**: 25 years

Age Determining Date: Competitors must be at least 25 years old as of December 31, 2024.

Team Age Group: The youngest player on the team determines the team's age group. There are no age restrictions for players older than the youngest team member. Age groups are set at five-year intervals: 25+, 30+, 35+, 40+, 45+, and so on. Should fewer than three teams enter a particular age group, they can compete in the next youngest age group.

Note: This Championship is based on AQUA regulations, which may allow for exceptions regarding age groups.

Training Opportunities:

Training sessions will be available at various pools across Trinidad and Tobago two days before the competition starts. Teams may request training slots either in writing before arrival or upon registration. Additional training times may be announced during the Technical Meeting, depending on the number of entries.

Technical Meeting:

A Technical Meeting for coaches and managers will be held on Wednesday, July 24, 2024, at 10:00 am. The location will be announced on the official championship website. All teams must be registered before this meeting.

Competition Dates and Venue:

Dates: July 25-29, 2024 (subject to the number of participating teams) **Venue**: Marlins Swim Club and the National Aquatic Centre, Balmain Couva

Equipment: Electronic timing systems will be in place, conforming to AQUA -VIII.6.2

Equipment and Team Composition:

Teams must provide their own practice and warm-up water polo balls.

Official AQUA water polo balls will be provided for the matches.

Teams must bring their game caps, ensuring the numbers conform to AQUA rule WP 4. VI APPENDIX B.4.3

Note: As per AQUA Rule VIII.6.2, teams may list up to 15 players, comprising seven players and eight reserves. All players must be registered with the same club.











Entry Procedure and Fees:

A designated team representative must complete the online Team Water Polo Registration Form and pay the individual registration fee. Upon arrival, the completed team sheet with all players' signatures must be submitted at the technical meeting. Players can only play for one team.

Competition Format:

The format will depend on the number of teams in each age group. Teams in underrepresented age groups will be contacted to discuss the option of competing in the next youngest age group.

Reporting and Medals:

Teams must be ready to play at least 15 minutes before their scheduled match time.

Teams arriving more than 5 minutes late will forfeit the match, and a 5-0 score will be awarded to the opponent.

Medals will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams in each age group.

Note: Smoking is strictly prohibited within the National Aquatic Centre.

GOVERNING RULES:

The AQUA regulations, specific to Masters water sports in their most recent edition, will govern all five disciplines in the 2024 Trinidad and Tobago Masters Aquatics Championship. Competitors are responsible for familiarising themselves with these rules. https://www.worldaquatics.com/rules/competition-regulations

Results: A comprehensive set of championship results will be compiled after the event and made available on the official website.

Accreditation Desk: The desk will be open to all athletes from 8:00 am, starting July 19, 2024.
